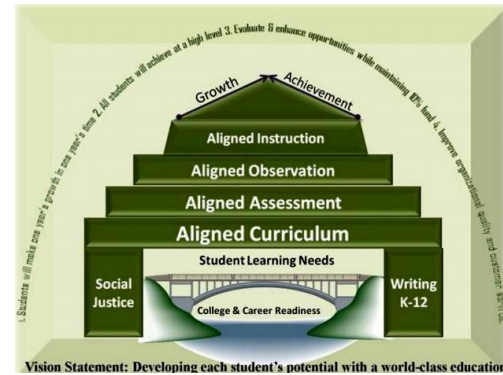

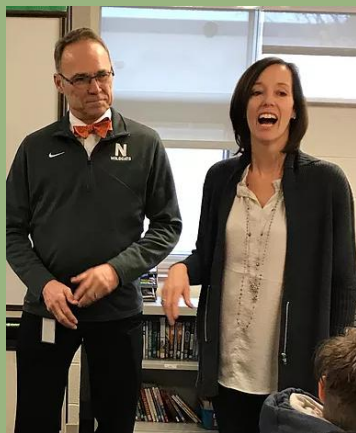

i9 Sports is an inclusive youth sports organization for soccer, t-ball, flag football, and basketball that is focused on providing fun, age-appropriate instruction for children, while also remaining convenient for parents and children with busy schedules. With new programs at Novi Woods for spring and summer seasons, i9 Sports has begun its assistance to the Novi Community School District this year, and has also helped

financially support students through the NEF. As part of their commitment to empowering students, they made a financial donation of \$1000 along with 3 free program seasons worth \$125 each to our Green Gala. i9 Sports' mission of helping children succeed in life through sports has connected it to the NEF in enriching the lives of students. i9 Sports is dedicated to teaching students the value



of sportsmanship, including the importance of respect, courage, and determination in weekly lessons and competitions, which is aligned with the NEF's support for team-building programs. 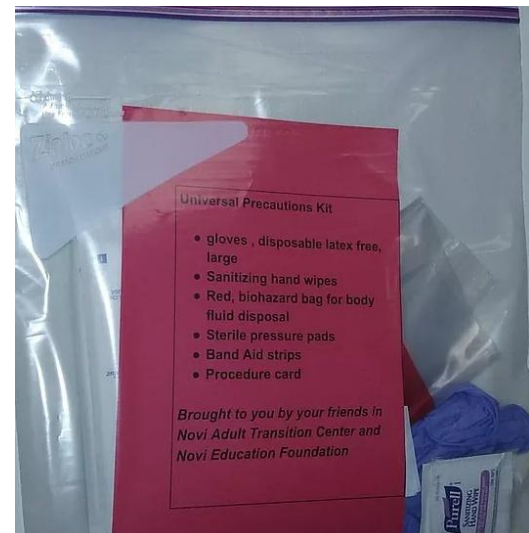

## *Innovative Teacher Grants*

The NEF supports innovative grants that promote new perspectives, creative thinking, and leadership within our students. In a learning community such as Novi, music instruction has a profound impact in the education of a child, in addition to breaking down cultural barriers and improving academic success. Ukuleles in the classroom, a grant applied for by Mr. Ownby, the music teacher at Parkview, have enhanced the basic music theory skills and literacy in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders. As music is shown to improve literacy, verbal memory, visual spatial processing, and mathematics, these ukuleles have helped Parkview students celebrate their diversity, connect to their core curriculum, and remain at the forefront of Elementary Music Education. Another grant that has greatly benefitted our students is Keeping Us Safe: One Class at a Time. All classrooms in the district have a

Kit available. In combining personal protection and immediate clean-up items to aid in the disposal of bacteria or spills, this grant has put an emphasis on safety within our community by guaranteeing necessary access to tools during an emergency situation. This NEF grant was awarded to Lori Burkhardt, a POST Secondary educator, to use as a learning project for her students. As our POST Secondary students enter the community and learn how to participate as citizens, they are able to give back to our district community by assembling these necessary safety kits for our students.
